(11) At the end of the first semester, as many freshmen <u>are pained</u> by a report card with unacceptable grades and a body that <u>had been taken</u> to the limit too many times, they <u>found</u> a new schedule: one that <u>is more conducive to academic excellence and physical well-being</u>.
